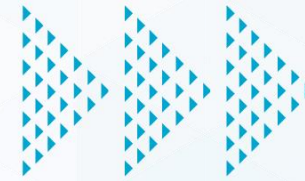

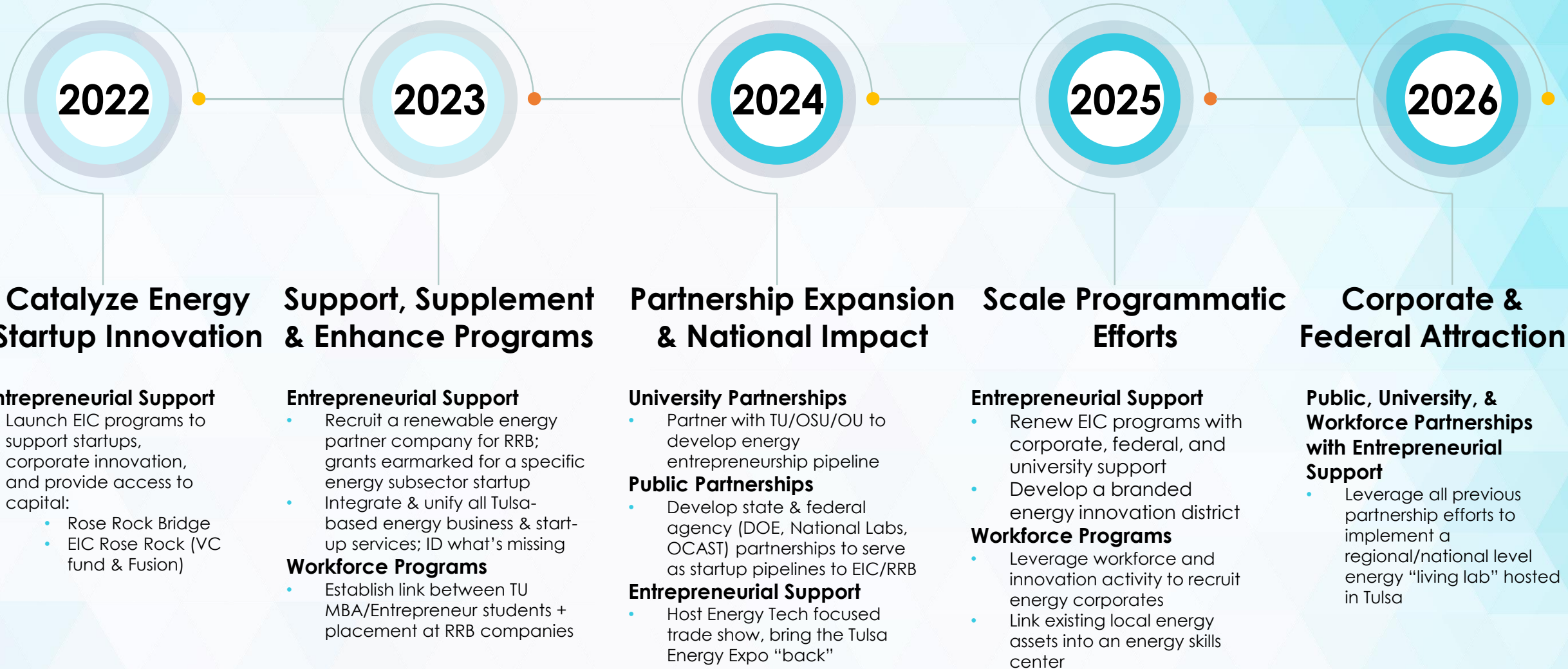
Launch initiatives that expand economic mobility

- Facilitate corporate innovation and fast-track the shift to energy transition

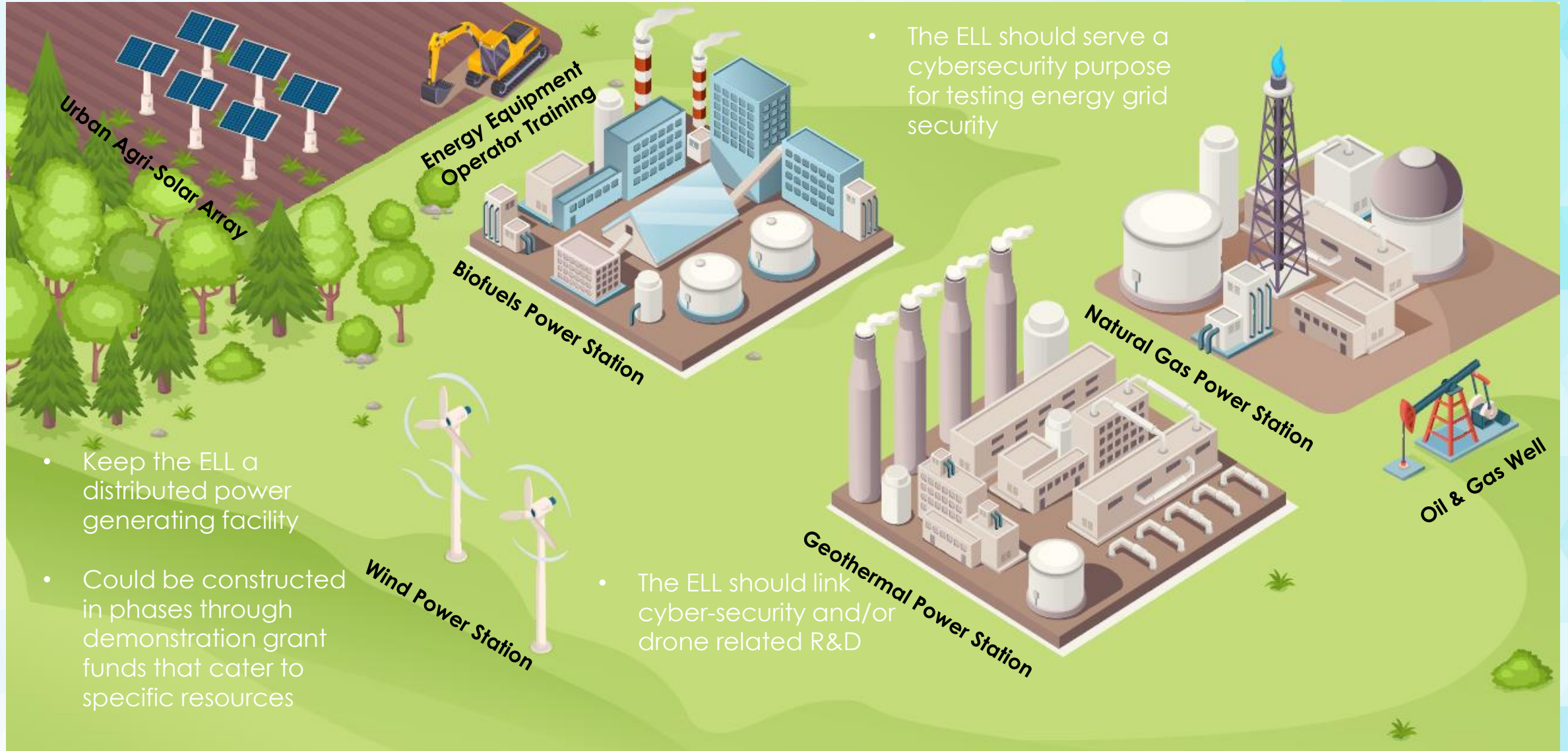
Milestones
