Introduction to NAICS

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) is the standard used by Federal statistical agencies in classifying business establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. business economy.

NAICS was developed under the auspices of the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), and adopted in 1997 to replace the <u>Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system</u>. It was developed jointly by the <u>U.S. Economic Classification Policy Committee (ECPC)</u>, <u>Statistics Canada</u> •, and Mexico's <u>Instituto Nacional de Estadistica y Geografia</u> •, to allow for a high level of comparability in business statistics among the North American countries.

This official U.S. Government Web site provides the latest information on plans for NAICS revisions, as well as access to various NAICS reference files and tools. Additional information on the background and development of NAICS is available in the <u>History</u> section of this Web site.

SBA Small Business Definition



- Is organized for profit
- Operates primarily within the U.S. or makes a significant contribution to the U.S. economy through payment of taxes or use of American products, materials or labor
- Is independently owned and operated
- Is not dominant in its field on a national basis
- Falls within designated size standard for its primary NAICS code




Share of employees working at small businesses by county





Small Business Set Asides



The federal government establishes formal goals to ensure small businesses get their fair share of work.

Every federal government purchase between \$10,000 and \$250,000 is automatically <u>set aside</u> for small businesses, as long as there are at least two companies that can provide the product or service at a fair and reasonable price.

Socially Disadvantaged Test



- Objective distinguishing feature that has contributed to social disadvantage (i.e. gender)
- Bias/discrimination experienced in American society, not elsewhere
- Chronic and substantial disadvantage, not fleeting or insignificant
- Impact on entry into or advancing in the American economy

Social Disadvantage Narrative



Your Social Disadvantage Narrative should include:

- Two separate and detailed incidents of bias
- Information/evidence that bias was more likely a motivating factor over other legitimate grounds for each incident
- Negative impact on your entry into or advancement in the business world

SBA may request additional information or clarification to make their determination

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

The Women-Owned Small Business Federal Contract Program (WOSB Program) is to help provide a level playing field for women business owners. The federal government limits competition for certain contracts to businesses that participate in the WOSB Program.

These contracts are specific industries where WOSBs are underrepresented. Some contracts are restricted further to economically disadvantaged women-owned small businesses (EDWOSBs). SBA maintains a list of those eligible industries and their NAICS codes.



Getting certified by SBA as veteran-owned (VOSB) makes your business eligible to compete for sole-source and set-aside contracts at the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The VA sets aside at least 7% of its contracts each year specifically for certified VOSBs and SDVOSBs. You can also compete for contracts under other qualifying socio-economic programs.


Benefits for service-disabled veteran-owned small businesses

Getting certified by SBA as service-disabled veteran-owned (SDVOSB) makes your business eligible to compete for sole-source and set-aside contracts. At least 3% of all federal contracting dollars each year are set aside specifically for certified SDVOSBs. You can also compete for contracts under other qualifying socio-economic programs.



HUBZone Employee Definition



- Earnings reported on Form W-2
- Employed full-time or part-time basis
- Works a minimum of 40 hours in 4 weeks
- At least 35% of employees must reside in a HUBZone
- Residency supported by unexpired government- issued ID issued at least 180 days prior to application

- A supplier who wants to be able to receive purchase orders from the State will need to be registered in ARBuy. There is no cost to register.
- All persons who wish to receive notice of and participate in solicitations will need to register in ARBuy. There is no cost to register to receive notice of solicitations.
- Suppliers will receive solicitation notifications through ARBuy and respond to those solicitations through the system.

MWBE (Minority and Women- Owned Business Enterprise) Certification

Certified MWOBE



CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE OR CERTIFIED WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE. A procurement that does not exceed two (2) times the amount stated in Ark. Code Ann. § 19-11-204 (13) may be procured without seeking competitive bids or competitive sealed bids if the procurement is with a certified minority business enterprise or certified women-owned business enterprise. The certification process is administered by the Division of Minority and Women-owned Business Enterprise of the Arkansas Economic Development Commission.

Up to **\$40,000** (As of 7/21/2022)

AEDC MWOBE Eligibility



- At least 51 percent minority- or women-owned, operated, and managed on a daily basis
- In operation for at least two (2) years prior to applying for minority or women-owned business status
- Business has legal presence (license) to operate in Arkansas
- Majority owner(s) is/are legal permanent resident(s) of Arkansas

AEDC MWOBE Eligibility (continued)



- Applicant has:
 - Federal income tax returns showing proof of business income tax filings with the Internal Revenue Service
 - State income tax returns filed with the Arkansas
 Department of Finance and Administration for the previous two years
- Enterprise is a for-profit business
- Enterprise generates less than \$10,000,000 in average annual revenues






